Oradell Public Library cardholders can borrow passes or tickets for free admission to select area museums and attractions. To borrow a pass or for more information, please visit the library's Main Desk.



The Museum Pass Loan Program, generously funded by Friends of the Oradell Library donors, offers Oradell Public Library cardholders the opportunity to visit select museums and attractions at no cost. Following is a summary of participating venues and pass benefits:

American Museum of Natural History & Planetarium, Central Park West at 79th Street, New York, NY (www.amnh.org). Each family may request up to two vouchers per library fiscal year (July-June). Each voucher provides admission to the museum and one special exhibit/IMAX for one person. Note: Subject to availability. Vouchers are limited.

Frick Collection, 1 East 70th Street, New York, NY (www.frick.org). Cardholders can borrow a pass for admission for two people. Note: Children under 10 not permitted.

Guggenheim Museum, 1071 5th Avenue, New York, NY (www.guggenheim.org). Cardholders may borrow a pass that provides admission for two adults, all children under 18 in household, and three guests. Note: Closed on Thursdays.

Intrepid Sea, Air & Space Museum, Pier 86, W. 46th Street and 12th Avenue, New York, NY (www.intrepidmuseum.org). Cardholders can borrow a pass that admits up to six people with entrance via an express line. Note: Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.



World of Wings, 1775 Windsor Road, Teaneck, NJ (www.wowbutterfly.com). Cardholders may borrow a pass that provides admission for four people and allows additional tickets to be purchased at a 50% discount. Note: Closed on Mondays and Tuesdays and first floor only open on Wednesdays and Thursdays.



Program Details: Passes are available to Oradell Public Library cardholders (age 18 and up) on a first-come, first-served basis and cannot be renewed. Passes must be returned within the time period specified in the loan agreement. A \$50 cash deposit will be collected at the time of the loan and refunded when the pass is returned to the Main Desk on time. Late returns will result in a forfeiture of the deposit. If a pass is lost or stolen, the borrower is responsible for the cost of a replacement. Availability and benefit details are subject to change. Museums may require pass borrowers to present a valid Oradell library card at the time of entry.
